

## Adaptation-integration Courses

The purpose of the adaptation-integration courses is to enable foreigners to navigate themselves in the Czech society.

The course will introduce you to Czech cultural customs, and you will find out how to behave in everyday situations – for example at the post office, in the shop or at the doctor's. You will also learn how the Czech healthcare and education systems work. You will obtain information about family life, accommodations, entrepreneurship, insurance, and other areas of everyday life which you can come across as a foreigner in Czechia. Furthermore, you will be introduced to some organizations which offer free consultation, language courses and other services to foreigners.

### Who are these Courses for?

Adaptation-integration courses are mandatory for some foreigners from third countries, especially those who obtained a residence permit **after January 1, 2021**. The courses do not apply to every foreigner. For example, people younger than 15 years old and older than 61 years old are exempt

from participating in the course.

If you have to participate the adaptation course, do not tardy. You have to participate in the course within a year from obtaining a residence permit in the Czech Republic. If you fail to do so, you can be fined up to 10,000 Czech crowns.

### Where and When Can You Take the Course

The Centre for Foreigners organizes the courses in Brno at Mezírka 1. In March there will be courses in these languages: English, Vietnamese, Arabic, Ukrainian and Russian.
