Every Czech citizen aged 18 and over, as well as EU citizens with temporary or permanent residence, has the right to vote.

Citizens of non-EU countries do not have this right.

HOW DO I VOTE?

I'm an EU citizen with temporary or permanent residence and I'm going to vote for the first time:

1. Apply to be added to the electoral roll (voter list) at the district office ("Úřad Městské části") you live in (by 21.9.2022 at the latest). Take your identity card and proof of residence in the Czech Republic with you.

I've recently become a Czech citizen and I'm going to vote for the first time:

1. You do not need to register for the electoral roll (voter list).

2. You can find out which polling station to vote at by checking the website of the office of the municipality, city or district. Based on your residential address, you will be able to check where your polling station is. Your ballot paper will come to you by mail or you can also collect it at the polling station.

3. Now you can vote for representatives of a municipality, city or district (e.g. in cities that are split into districts, such as Prague). Where you vote depends on your place of residence.

If you live in Prague 11, Prague 10, or Prague 6, you can also vote for representatives for the Senate. Ballot papers for municipal council elections are grey; ballots for Senate elections are yellow.



Don't forget to bring a valid ID (ID card or passport) and, for EU citizens, proof of permanent or temporary residence.
